The driving events at the Western Idaho State Fair and the Payette County Fair are almost upon us, and our Clay Maier clinic is right around the corner. Enjoy the summer; beautiful fall days will be here before you know it.

JUNE 27 MEETING MINUTES

The June meeting was held at Lori Girdner's home in Eagle. President Jan McEnroe called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. There were ten members present. Lee made a motion to carry the reading of the minutes of the last meeting to the next meeting. The motion was seconded and passed. Mary made a motion to approve the minutes of the March meeting. That motion was seconded and passed.

Treasurer's Report: Kathy was not present, but sent her report with Mary. For the accounting period of April 20, 2012 to June 27, 2012, we had a beginning balance of \$7573.96 and an ending balance of \$6723.92. Expenses totaling \$887.56 included arena rental, cones, balls, deposit tickets, and food. Income totaling \$835 included arena rental income from members, membership fees, and clinic fees.

Old Business: Amanda sent word that the dressage cones had been purchased, but the dressage arena was still pending. For the Pleasure Driving show to be held October 27 and 28. Amanda valuntaared to be show.

27 and 28, Amanda volunteered to be show secretary and Mary volunteered to be coordinator. Rosie said we are on track for the Western Idaho Fair. At her request, Mary made a motion that we allow the fair to use our cones. The motion was seconded and passed.

The Payette County Fair's driving show will be August 11. (*Correction: this event is August 9.*)

New Business: We have a vacancy for Vice Chair. Jan asked for volunteers to fill the position. Donna said she would be interested, Jan recommended her for the position, and the club voted to appoint her to the position.

Mary expressed an interest in putting the club newsletter on a regular schedule. After some discussion, the schedule for newsletters is August, November, February, and May. Any info you want put in the newsletter needs to be sent to Mary by the 1st of the month. The newsletter will be sent out by email or snail mail in approximately one week. Everyone needs to contribute! Tell us what you're doing with your horses, if you purchase a new horse, or acquire a new cart.

Brit will be our phone tree chairperson.

Information on the Clay Maier clinic should be out on the website soon. Opening date to sign up for a spot at the clinic will be about August 1. There was some discussion about the club hosting a CDE or Horse Driving Trial. Some possible venues are Birt's, Simplot's, or the Idaho Center. A committee consisting of Amanda, Linda, Jan, Donna, Brit, Karole, and Rosie will look at the possibilities, interest, and costs involved and report back.

The Weiser River Drive will be October 12-14, traveling 32 miles from Midvale to Council. The next meeting will be August 8, at Brit's house at 7:00 p.m. Show up at 5 if you're interested in driving, and plan for a potluck after. Respectfully submitted, Barb Recla

SNAKE RIVER STAMPEDE PARADE Jan McEnroe:

It was good ole fashioned fun Saturday, July 14 at the Snake River Stampede Rodeo Parade. Hundreds gathered on the streets of Nampa for the event.

You wouldn't see more horses in one place than this parade because it's one of the largest all horse-drawn parades in the nation. It is a longstanding tradition in Nampa, dating back to the early 1920's.

Adding spice to the parade was a lively assortment of authentically costumed individuals, numerous breeds of horses, along with a variety of carts, buggies, and wagons.

INAVALE CDE Linda Kaye Jones:

Three Idaho drivers, an Oregonian and a kid headed out to the CDE at Inavale July 13-15. Amanda Horton with her Morab mare Ivy, Linda Kaye Jones and Amanda's Arabian gelding Flash, Kathy and Robin DeLong and their Fjord gelding Razzle and John Munson with his Fjord pair Hagar and Flint all made the day long trip to Philomath (near Corvallis) Oregon.



Friday's Dressage phase found Amanda in first place in Training Single Ponies with 45.82 penalty points. Kathy and Razzle put in a lovely test as well earning 55.64 and standing in 4th place. Linda and Flash had some tension issues. John was standing in 2nd place in Training Pair Ponies after Dressage. Saturday was marathon day and Cation got to navigate for Amanda. He kept her from missing a gate and they ended up with the best Training Level Marathon award. Kathy incurred 5.4 time penalties but was sitting well in third place going into cones.



Linda got to experience the time factor involved in showing Preliminary and had some good hazards and some not so good. John incurred some penalties in the marathon and remained in second place. Amanda and Ivy went double clear in cones to clinch the win in the Training Level Single Ponies division on Sunday. Kathy's Razzle was dismissed at the post-marathon vet check (later Kathy discovered that Razzle had suffered a stone bruise.) Linda and Flash had a nice trip through cones with only two balls down. John and his pair finished the CDE in second in Training Pair Ponies.

A couple of tagalongs were Linda's sons, Cation and Adarsh, and their pony, Dream Girl. Cation navigated for Amanda and drove Dream Girl in a special combined test put together for 3 youth exhibitors; Cation Jones, Ster Paagman, and Leeza Yanik. Cation and Ster shared Dream Girl, the Jones' 12 hand Hackney Pony mare. Leeza drove her grandmother's 12 hand Welsh pony. It was a wonderful way for young drivers to experience the close knit and light hearted atmosphere of combined driving events.

Clay Maier's lifetime of experience with many breeds includes over two decades of work with Friesian horses. His well-honed skills include not only starting, training and exhibiting some of the country's best-known driven horses; but also developing the performance Friesians of "The Friesian Spectacular". In his hands, these magnificent horses effortlessly demonstrate some seemingly impossible lateral maneuvers while being driven.

Clay's clinics open new perspectives from the ground that will also bring a new understanding in the saddle and cart. Together, you and your horse can benefit from insights that long reining brings to whatever discipline you enjoy, from dressage, to trail riding, to driving. These clinics offer a superb opportunity to learn techniques directly from a master of long reining and driving horses.

This clinic will benefit anyone from the beginner to the advanced driver... You can develop driving skills that will make both you and your horse more confident, safe and successful. Clay can introduce you to the basics of driving, or help you with your specific driving goals.

Clay's goal in teaching is to have his students gain confidence in the techniques by hands-on practice during the clinic. He uses clear, easy-to-understand exercises embedded in a solid foundation of the Maier style of building a training relationship with your horse. Kind communication and consistency, matched with his perspective on what the horse is thinking, are the keystones.

Clay is traveling between shows, so not only will you and Clay both work with your own horse, but you will also have the rare opportunity to get a better feel of the reins by long reining/driving Clay's seasoned troupe of Friesians.

Clay was asked to represent the United States at the Queen's Jubilee in England this year. He will have the DVD with him on his visit to Nampa. We will have a chance to be the first to watch this presentation with Clay.
