MESSAGE FROM THE EDITOR:

This is a very brief newsletter; we have had some changes to our spring schedule, and I wanted to get the word out.

NOVEMBER 20, 2013 MEETING MINUTES Barb Recla:

The meeting, held at the Sunrise Café in Middleton, Idaho, was called to order at 7:06 by Mary Van De Bogart. She was substituting for Jan McEnroe. There were 12 members present. We had two guests, Richard Cummings and Jake Steele, the Munson's grandson. New member, Brenda DeLong, was counted among those present.

We didn't have a copy of the minutes to read at the meeting, so Amanda Horton made a motion that approving the minutes be deferred to the next meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

Financial report by Kathy DeLong:

For the accounting period of 11/20/13 to 1/15/14 Beginning Balance: \$4141.15; ending balance: \$4258.41 Expenses: \$87.74; Income: \$205.00

A major expense we need to approve is our insurance with Equisurance. The cost was \$899.90 in 2013. Amanda made a motion that we renew the insurance up to \$1000.00. The motion was seconded and passed.

Correspondence: We received a letter from ADS. Committee reports

Bombproofing playday: Feb. 22, 2014. We need a lot of volunteers. The Roughriders, who have helped in the past, will not be doing so this year. We discussed having activities for people waiting in line (hot drinks, photography). (Maybe we could copy the idea used by some stores—having people take a number and wait at the location of their choice until their number is up.)

Club insurance for 2014: Jan, Kathy and Amanda will discuss what events need to be covered.

CAA Driver Proficiency Program sessions (Jan. 25, Feb. 1 and 15): The session held Jan. 11 was well-attended. John would like to have the evaluator come to our area in March. We need to pick an arena suitable for the test with room for a simulated road and a real, but not heavily trafficked road nearby.

ADT March 22: Amanda is organizing this and needs volunteers. After some discussion, she will ask Linda to judge.

New Business:

HDT A drive in the Park (June 7-8): Amanda is looking for sponsorships and volunteers. One of the judges will be Ruth Graves; Keith Yutzy will build the course. Daryl is building ten panels from wood poles to be used as hazards. Jan would like us to hold a silent auction during the event. Dressage and cones will be Saturday and the marathon will be Sunday. We want to encourage the public to come out and enjoy watching the events. Amanda would like someone to organize the volunteers. Kathy and friends will be in charge of decorations.

The Des Arab Club would like to use our slot at Birt arena on April 26. Since we won't be using it this year, we'll let them do that.

Budget: We need to be sure our budget can cover the events we agree to sponsor. Amanda made a motion that we have officers and organizers of various events meet to go through the budget and report back to members. The motion was seconded and passed.

Amanda reported that the Des Arab club will hold a Class A USEF show on May 8-11 that will include some driving events. The show is open to Arabs and half-Arabs only. She would like to loan them some equipment for this show. Also, they could use volunteers to help.

Gabe made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:22. The motion was seconded and passed.

CHANGES TO SPRING ACTIVITES:

Mary Van De Bogart:

We were originally scheduled to have an Arena Driving Trial on March 22; but no one that we talked to were ready for such a thing this early in the season. So, after much discussion, we have decided to have a schooling playday instead, which should offer some opportunities both for very green horses and drivers, and for the more experienced.

We are planning to set up the dressage arena for practice (and will be available to work with new drivers who are unfamiliar with driven dressage).

We're also planning an obstacle type course that will be suitable to drive through, long-rein through, or even just lead your horses through; probably something similar to the "Town and Country" cones course. We'd also like to set up a standard cones course to practice in.

If weather permits, we will set up some of the stuff outside; also, we can lead / long rein / ride in the outdoor trail course (It is not set up for driving a horse put to a vehicle). If the weather is bad, we will set up the dressage arena in the morning, followed by an obstacle course, and finishing up with the timed cones.

We will be having a potluck lunch, so plan on bringing something and having a good meal with us. John Munson will be speaking to us about the upcoming CAA examinations at lunch time. There will be no charge for this event. Those under 18 will need to have a parent sign a liability waiver, and need to wear a helmet if they are driving or riding on a vehicle, or riding..

This will be a very good opportunity for those of you with green horses, or for green drivers, to come and work in a lowstress setting; as well as for the more experienced folks who just haven't quite got it together yet this wet spring!

We have our two-day weekend back in April (April 26-27), as the other group decided that they didn't want it after all. We will be discussing what to do with these days at the business meeting March 19th. Amanda Horton, who usually organizes and runs our ADT's, will be out of town.


PRACTICE TIME AT BIRT ARENA:

CAA PROFICIENCY EXAMINATIONS:

(Editor's note: this information is from an e-mail sent out by John Munson, who has been hosting a study group for this exam this spring. If you are interested in taking the examination, contact John at 898-4147.)

In my most recent conversation with Jane Moody (our evaluator) and Jill Ryder (of the CAA) the simulated road layout will be used for the road test. This means that you will not have to take your horse on the road. I know that this caused much concern on the part of quite a number of our members.

Jane will arrive in Boise on Friday 04APR14. She has agreed to do a presentation for us on Friday night. This will be held in my barn where we have been meeting (24875 Lansing Lane, Middleton). During this session, Jane will carefully outline what she expects to see when she tests you so that there are no surprises for you or for her.

I'm not sure, at this point, just where we will do the road tests. If the weather looks to be good for that weekend we can do them all at my facility.

We will begin the testing at 9:00 AM on Saturday and Sunday. Each test will take approximately 1 1/2 hours. This means that we can schedule about 10 people for testing.

There will be no observers during the test. The only people that may be present for your test are you, your groom and Iane

If you are going to take the test, please let me know ASAP so that I can begin to prepare an order of go. Again, I would remind you that the application form must be filled out and sent in to the CAA. In case you have lost yours, I have attached a PDF of this form. (Ed.-I have included this form later in the newsletter).

As I hear from those that are going to take the test, I will send you a PDF of the Level 1 and Road Driving Syllabus.
