TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR HORSE OWNERS

(from "Notes from All Mosta Ranch", Flathead Beacon, September 15, 2010.)

- 1) My life is likely to last 30-40 years. Any separation from you is likely to be painful.
- 2) Give me time to understand what you want of me. Place your trust in me. It is crucial for my well-being.
- 3) Don't be angry with me for long and don't ignore me as punishment. You have your work, your friends, your entertainment, but I have only you.
- 4) Talk to me. Quietly. Even if I don't understand your words, I do understand your voice when speaking to me. Be aware that however you treat me, I will never forget it.
- 5) Before you hit or strike me, remember that I could hurt you, and yet, I choose not to.
- 6) Before you scold me for being lazy or uncooperative, ask yourself if something might be bothering me or that I might just not understand what it is you are asking of me. Perhaps I'm not getting the right food, I have been in the sun too long, or my heart might be getting old or weak. Make sure your horse has a complete medical exam by a veterinarian at least once a year!
- 7) Please take care of me when I grow old, and don't ignore me or throw me away. You, too, will grow old.
- 8) On the ultimate difficult journey, go with me please. Never say you can't bear to watch. Don't make me face this alone. Everything is easier for me if you are there, because I love you so.
- 9) Prepare for disasters. Make sure that you have a plan for your horse in the event of a fire, flood, storm, or tornado.
- 10) Plan for your horse's future in case something happens to you and visit humanesociety.org/petsinwills for more information.

The Treasure Valley Whips hold several play days each year. **These events are** open to anyone who is interested in learning more about driving, from beginners without horses to experienced drivers. The February 26th & March 26th play days will be held at the Birt Arena facility in Nampa, Idaho (see directions at bottom of the next page). There are several areas that can be used at the facility, depending upon the weather. We typically include a "bomb-proofing" area with lots of flags, plastic, tires, etc. to get our horses accustomed to, usually while leading them through the area. This makes the play day an excellent place to bring a green or young horse for some experience. After 3:00 or so the indoor arena is available for carriage drivers for 20 minute individual sessions and we will also have some group sessions for those wanting to get experience with others in the ring. We also set up some driving courses (e.g. cones, hazards, & dressage) for participants to learn and to practice. Our participants include folks who are leading their horses, ground driving them, driving hitched to a vehicle, riding their horses as well as those who are just coming to get more information. The club also sets up an information table with all sorts of articles, magazines, pamphlets, catalogs and other educational information about driving.

The schedule is kept fairly unstructured, so that the participants can set their own pace, but occasional demonstrations and lessons may be offered as well.

The play days are open to the public, but membership is rewarded with a discount. Please bring a dish to share in our Potluck Lunch!

Cost is \$10 per member bringing up to 2 horses each (\$5 for each additional horse; \$20 for a non-member bringing a horse (\$20 per horse).

These fees are used to defray the costs of the facility rental, insurance, equipment, etc. Members get a discount, because they invest in the club to fund the overhead expenses. If you are not a member, look into joining. The club needs members to cover annual expenses, and you will ultimately benefit financially!

RULES

1. Don't hesitate to ask for help if you need it!

We all needed a lot of help when we first started and those of us who have been at this a while still need help. This is one of the main reasons to have this club – to help one another. Don't be shy! Members should be wearing name tags.

2. Use caution and common sense even when there are no rules covering a situation!

There are many levels of horsemanship and training at these events. You should not only be able to control your animal, but you must be aware of you and your animals' behavior as it may affect the other people and horses around you.

3. Please observe a "walk-only" speed limit for horses in the parking lot area including the road along the parking lot and the arena.

There are many green horses and drivers working by the trailers, let's help them out by creating a "wake-free zone". Boaters will understand ©

4. No driving (hooked to a carriage) in the indoor bomb-proofing area- Riding and ground driving allowed only if not objected to by the others in the arena at the same time.

There will be an opportunity for carriage driving in the bomb-proofing area in the outdoor arena later in the afternoon; a schedule will be posted.

5. <u>Do not overload the bomb-proofing area – no more than one horse per obstacle – please comply with the directions of the person controlling the gate.</u>

Many of the horses going through the obstacles are green and are reacting (shying, etc.) to what they see. This is the whole point of the exercise. Please leave plenty of room between horses and be careful with the tack you have on the horse to avoid getting snagged on the hazards. Further rules may be posted; the Gate attendant has control.

6. No tying horses in the indoor arena or along the outside rail.

There is too much human and horse traffic for this practice to be safe at these events.

7. Open Driving in the Indoor Arena - use sign up sheets for determining arena use.

There will be a sign-up sheet for drivers to use to determine when they may use the indoor arena. There will be some group driving time (no more than 6 at a time) and some individual time available.

8. Children are welcome, but please supervise your charges.

Make sure your child's activity is not spooking the horses and that your child is not playing in an area where there is horse traffic. We want these kids to grow up to be drivers!
