## REIN BOARD CLINIC

*John Munson:*

On January 14th the club hosted a rein board clinic at the Munson's house. There were three different points of discussion. First, we discussed how to construct a rein board. Second, we talked about how to use the rein board to improve rein handling. This involves the shortening and lengthening of the reins without altering the relative positions of the reins. Finally, we discussed the Achenbach rein handling method. This method was developed over the years by coachmen and whips who had to drive for extended periods. The Achenbach method allows a whip to sit and hold the reins comfortably while maintaining precise control of the horses.



## CLAY MAIER CLINIC

*Mary Van De Bogart:*

On November 11-13 I audited the Clay Maier long lining clinic hosted by the Treasure Valley Whips carriage driving club. I found it to be extremely interesting, and got solutions to several issues that I have struggled with in the past – namely, not being able to move fast enough to keep my contact light and even, not being able to manipulate the reins and the whip effectively, and worrying about a “fresh” or intractable horse either wrapping itself or me up in the lines, or escaping entirely.


The Friday evening dinner and demonstration was friendly, informal, and informative; everyone felt at ease by the end of the evening. I liked the fact that a local horse that most of us know was used for the demonstration; it made things much more interesting than if it had been some unknown equine. By the end of the evening I was kicking myself for not participating, rather than auditing.

The lessons were very interesting to watch. The explanations and techniques were quite clear and easy to follow; I didn't have that “Just what are they doing, anyway?” feeling that one often has when watching other people's lessons. I liked the way that everything was kept so calm and friendly; both the equines and the humans were put at ease. I felt welcome to ask questions and request clarification.

After the clinic, I was able to try out my newly acquired information on both my driving partner of seven years, and a new mare that I am trying out. I have gone back to long lines repeatedly to solve issues with my older pony; I could usually get the job done, but with a lot of tension and resistance. Using the longer, heavier lines and some of the new techniques, I was able to obtain a much softer feel, and the resistance was greatly diminished. It has turned out to be a delightful way to keep her (and myself) fit over the winter, and she seems to enjoy it a lot. It has also been a lovely way to get in synch with the new mare; I have been able to learn a lot about her without the anxiety of being hitched up to somebody that you don't know very well yet! Usually when I audit clinics things don't work out as well as when I have a “hands-on” experience; but I was pleasantly surprised to get extremely good results on my own at home after this one.

I would recommend this clinic highly to anyone who is interested in making the most of their horse. It was one of the most useful and eye-opening clinics that I have attended.

Within a short time, Clay had Ginger reaching for the bit with a long relaxed neck and moving effortlessly in a beautiful bend.

Throughout the weekend we would watch the transformation in each of the equine/human pairs that participated. It was a fun and relaxed weekend and we all learned so much. We look forward to having Clay return in September for another awesome weekend. We will have additional information out to you soon.

A few of the participants and auditor feedbacks: "Mr. Maier would quickly analyze the human/horse pair and then proceed to give communication to the horse and human to help them improve their communication and performance. He worked tirelessly for two days assisting participants and auditors and giving excellent instruction to them. While working with individual horse/human pairs Mr. Maier continued a good dialog that both informed and engaged everyone in the audience in addition to the pair he was working with. Several members of the Whips Club commented following the clinic that it was "the best clinic they had ever participated in". **Minutes for meeting on January 19, 2012**  
**Sunrise Restaurant, Middleton, ID**

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by president, Jan McEnroe. There were approximately 10 members present. No one had a copy of the minutes from the last meeting. Lee made a motion to table reading and approving the minutes until the next meeting. Kathy seconded the motion, and it passed.

Treasurer's Report: For the accounting period of November 16, 2011 to January 19, 2012, we had a beginning balance of \$6,269.77 and an ending balance of \$4853.17. Income was \$1280 from the Clay Maier clinic, memberships, and a donation from Donna Knipe for printing. Expenses included the ADS membership for \$60.00 and previous checks that cleared totaling \$2636.60. Kathy filled out our annual report. She and Jan determined the number of days we need to have insured this year and determined it would cost \$900-\$950. Kathy made a motion that she pay reasonable costs to Equi-sure for insurance for this coming year and fill out any necessary forms.

The motion passed.

We have a new member, Christine Sword, who has an Arab she is beginning to drive.

Old business:

A Rein Board clinic was held January 14 at Munson's. The 8 or 9 people present had a chance to practice or learn how to hold reins in one hand and how to hold them for multi-horse driving.

Mary Van De Bogart showed us several designs she had worked up on the computer to go on our shirts. We'll vote later tonight on the favorite.

Jan purchased a new Skydancer to scare horses with at the desensitizing clinics. It is red, 20 feet tall, with arms and hair!

New business:

It was noted that we need a new secretary and newsletter editor. Jan made a motion that Barb Recla be secretary. The motion was seconded by Kathy and passed. Mary is willing to continue with the newsletter, but she would like more information and articles from members to include in it. It was suggested that people in charge of events write up an article before and after the event with any results from shows included. The newsletter is supposed to be produced quarterly, but due to the timing of our events, it won't be exactly on the 3 month schedule. If anyone has any information to get out to members, send it to Mary.

The fitness and conditioning workshop to be put on by Tom Noll and friend will be January 28 at the corner of

Lake Hazel and Ten Mile. The address is on the website. It will be a hands-on clinic, with a potluck and slide show afterwards. The cost is \$10, and you don't need to sign up ahead of time.

After the members picked their favorite design, Donna made a motion that the club purchase 2 dozen T-shirts in assorted colors to be sold to members. Debbie seconded it, and the motion passed.

Kathy made a motion, seconded by Mary, that the May 19 and 20 Megan Sibiga clinic be held. The motion passed.

Amanda made a motion by proxy (she was not there, but submitted the motion in writing) that the club subsidize the April and May Megan Sibiga clinics so that members will pay only \$75 per lesson and that the conditions of accepting entries be followed as proposed. Is out there chomping hay!


